What are cookies?

Cookies are small data files that are placed onto your computer’s hard drive or in your web browser memory when you visit a website. Almost every website uses cookies.

What are cookies for?

Cookies help to make your experience of using a website better. For example, they can remember the information you supply as you register with a website so that you can sign in with one click next time. What cookies don’t do is store any confidential information about you personally.

The cookies on our website simply allow us to track generic usage of our website – not your individual usage behaviour.

Types of cookies that may be used during your visit to the website:

The following type of cookies is used on this site. We don’t list every single cookie used by name – but for each type of cookie we tell you how you can control its use.

1. Analytics cookies

These monitor how visitors move around the Website and how they reached it. This is used so that we can see total (not individual) figures on which types of content users enjoy most, for instance.

You can opt out of these if you want.

Where you provide your consent, we use Google Analytics ([Data privacy and security – Analytics Help \(google.com\)](#)) cookies to collect information about how you use miandassociates.com. This includes IP addresses.

Google Analytics processes information about:

- the pages you visit on miandassociates.com
- how long you spend on each miandassociates.com page
- how you got to the site
- what you click on while you’re visiting the site

We make sure you cannot be directly identified by Google Analytics data. We do this by using Google Analytics' IP address anonymisation feature and by removing any other personal data from the titles or URLs of the pages you visit.

We will not combine Google Analytics information with other data sets in a way that would directly identify who you are.

2. Third-party service cookies

Social sharing, video and other services we offer are run by other companies. These companies may drop cookies on your computer when you use them on our site or if you are already logged in to them.

Please refer to the respective platform's privacy policies.

3. Site management cookies

These are used to maintain your identity or session on the Website. For instance, where our websites run on more than one server, we use a cookie to ensure that you are sent information by one specific server (otherwise you may log in or out unexpectedly). These cookies cannot be turned off individually but you could change your browser setting to refuse all cookies (see above) if you do not wish to accept them.

Are cookies safe?

Yes, they are. Cookies are small text files. They can't look into your computer or read any personal information or other material on your hard drive. Cookies can't transmit viruses or install anything harmful on your computer.

Why should I keep cookies turned on?

We would like you to keep cookies active on your computer during your visits to our website because parts of the site rely on them to work properly. For example, you would not be able to view a location map without them.

How can I turn cookies off?

You can at any time change or withdraw your consent from the Cookie Declaration on our website.
